THE Nantwich Choral Society will be opening the prestigious Festival of Music at Beckenham, on Saturday for the second year running.

The group were asked back after bowling last year's audiences over with their performance of The Messiah with which they opened the event.

This time around the society are planning to start with Haydn's Creation, conducted by their musical director Stephen Buckman, a professional musician who travels down from London each week to rehearse the 86 strong choir.

The engagement is the first of many in the group's busy new season, with a special concert on November 3 which
